2. In [v. 1](#), what is the difference between, supplications, prayers, intercessions and thanksgivings? Use a Bible dictionary or an online tool like Blue Letter Bible.
3. Read [1 Timothy 2:2-4](#). How do these verses align with the following passages: [Ezekiel 33:11](#); [John 3:14-17](#), [6:37](#); [Romans 10:12-13](#). What do they say?
4. Read [Titus 3:1-3](#). What instruction are we given regarding the relationship to leaders the Lord has set over us? What additional instructions are given in [Romans 13:1-7](#)?
5. What is the benefit of praying evangelistically for the church? What are we promised in [2 Timothy 3:12](#)?
6. Read [2 Peter 3:9](#). God is patient. What responsibility have we been given as God's daughters as it relates to saving all people? Read [Matthew 5:14-16](#); [Luke 24:46-48](#); [1 Peter 2:9](#).
7. Read [1 Timothy 2:5-6](#). What is the truth?
8. What do [John 14:6](#) and [1 Timothy 2:5-6](#) have in common?

9. Read [Romans 10:14-15](#). What does it teach us? How does it relate to [1 Timothy 2:7](#)?

10. [1 Timothy 2:8](#); [Matthew 5:44](#); [Luke 23:34](#); [Hebrews 7:25](#); [James 1:6-8](#). How are we to pray? How does Jesus give us an example?

Look Out:

11. Why is it easier for us to share the Gospel in Canada vs. a country like India or perhaps in the Middle East? What are the challenges we face sharing the Gospel because of where we live?

12. Read [Luke 24:45-49](#); [Acts 1:8](#); [Zechariah 4:6](#). On who and what do we need to depend as we share the Gospel?

13. Think about how the truth outlined in [v. 5-6](#) can be proclaimed in a culture that believes that there are many ways to God. Discuss.

Look In:

14. Is praying the easiest thing for you to do or the most difficult? Explain.

15. Do you have both Christian and non-Christian friends? In what ways do you pray for them differently? Explain.

16. How do you pray for leaders in our church family? Of our country and others? What kinds of prayers should you pray for politicians you don't agree with? How might your prayers affect your attitude towards them?

17. How does knowing that Jesus is interceding for you impact you?
